

MOVING INTERNATIONALLY WITH CHILDREN

Involve your children early on in the process

Ensure time for proper goodbyes



Plan a goodbye party with your children



Encourage the use of video-chat tools to stay in touch with friends & family



Take pictures of everyday routines, places & people before leaving



Give your children an address book

Find the right timing for your move

Move **before** school begins

Allow for jet lag to settle before school routines start - ideally 2 weeks prior

Do not move at the **beginning of a long school vacation** - boredom in a new place will **increase homesickness**

Help your children get adjusted



Keep old routines wherever possible & establish new ones quickly



Set up your children's room first to establish a sense of home



Ask the school if they offer a buddy system for better integration



Enroll your children in extra-curricular activities



Share your feelings & emotions



Plan a "bucket-list" of activities & places you would like to see together
